Goals/Objectives

- Describe MIGS and discuss the factors leading to its emergence, outline current indications for MIGS, and summarize and discuss commonly performed MIGS treatment options.
- Discuss current challenges in glaucoma medical management, outline novel drug delivery methods aimed to address glaucoma medical management challenges, and identify new glaucoma drug classes available and/or under investigation for the use in humans.
- Discuss intra-operative challenges in the surgical care of glaucoma patients, outline principles for safe glaucoma surgery and the need for a fluid surgical approach, and discuss various approaches to the management of malignant glaucoma.
- Define the relationship between epiphora and dry eye and describe methods to manage epiphora through dry eye treatment.
- Describe why a patient with a normal retina may still experience vision loss and summarize appropriate and effective management and treatment options.
- Describe and recognize the impact concussions have on ocular health and analyze the options for diagnosis and treatment for eye conditions which originated from a concussion.
